President's Report

The National Board met in Gatineau, Quebec on October 23, 24 & 25, 2018. The first order of business was to finalize the Three-Year Action Plan.

This is the plan:

- a) Strengthen relationship with CBC – meetings with upper management.
- b) Developed Mission/Vision/Values statements. (See next edition of CONTACT)
- c) Review Web Design and develop use of other social media.
- d) Pre-retirement Seminars organized by PNA in partnership with Unions and CBC
- e) Set a goal of increasing the membership to 55% within 3 years.
- f) Maintain contacts with Unions for access to lists of people planning retirement.
- g) Update PNA by-laws. (To be approved in May 2019)
- h) Succession Planning at National, Regional, Chapter and staff levels.
- i) Financial Records-regional financial statements to be submitted to National Treasurer.
- j) Review Memorandum of Agreement-Pension Plan Surplus Sharing.
- k) Bill C-27 – maintain active participation as a member of the Canadian Coalition.
- l) Surviving Spouses Pension Fairness Coalition - moving forward to amend the CBC plan.
- m) Supplementary Health Care Plan - maintain efforts to improve benefits, lower costs and open to new subscribers.

National Treasurer's Report - The update showed that the Association is being financially prudent.

Supplementary Health Care Plan - Reviewed the financial statement ending August 31st. The plan is currently in a surplus position and is expected to end the year in a surplus. The PNA asked the plan designers to come back with an increase in the Paramedical expense area. The PNA asked that the \$950.00 limited be increased. (Paramedical expenses will now be capped at \$1,150.00) *cont. page 2*

Employees' Assistance Program - An every employee/retiree mail out is in the works. It is intended to increase the awareness of the program. The PNA hopes to dovetail on this mail out with PNA enrollment information.

CCSB - Special Assistance Fund – Statistics show that between 2013 and now \$951,165.00 in expenses were claimed by retirees and employees. Hearing aids lead 215 payments. If you have something you would like assistance with, please contact Dianne or Suzie at the PNA Office for guidance.

Pension Plan Update - Alain Pineau is the PNA representative on the Pension Plan Board. Alain updated us on the status of the Pension Plan. It is possible that by the end of this year, the plan may be in a surplus position; If not this year probably next year. A surplus can only be determined as of December 31 each year. As interest rates grow, so does the pension plan which now exceeds \$7,000,000,000 (billion). The solvency ratio currently sits at 101.0%. It must exceed 105.0% to be in a surplus position. When it does reach a surplus position there are several steps that must be completed before it can be distributed.

A meeting of the PNA executive board and CBC management is being arranged to occur soon to review the Memorandum of Agreement-Pension Plan Sharing.

The PNA will be asking the CBC to give retiring employees a consent form allowing the PNA to have the retiree's name and address. We encourage you to talk to your retired CBC friends who are not members and encourage them to join.

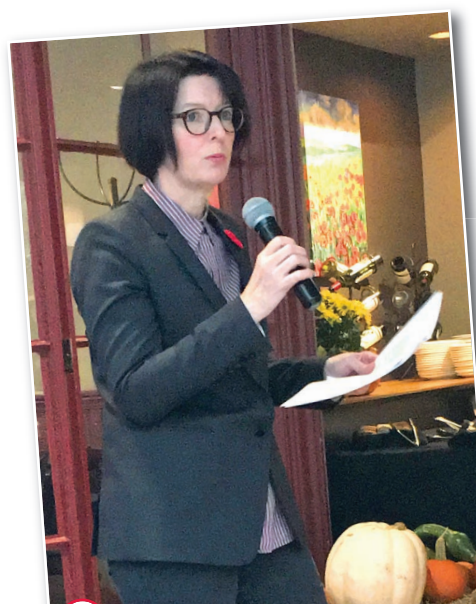

AGM NOTES

AGM guest speaker, Heather Conway, Executive Vice-president, English Services, CBC

Just a few days before the announcement of her exit from the CBC, Heather Conway was our guest speaker. What follows are some of the highlights from her talk.



Programming - When Heather became Executive VP, she had a vision of what the corporation could and should be – more distinctly Canadian, more diverse and more digital. For her, great strides have been made, while staying true to the Corporation's mandate to inform, enlighten and entertain. Shows like Murdoch, Anne with an E, Kim's Convenience, Shitt's Creek and Baroness von Sketch have performed well both in Canada and internationally. TV is investing in News and Arts and Documentary programming and she believes that ensuring coverage of Canadian artists and the "creative process" through shows like In the Making is an important part of CBC's mandate. CBC is also deepening its commitment to high performance amateur sports.

CBC and the digital environment - Right now, the foundation is being built for a digital CBC, one that will replace the linear and in our lifetime. Some digital stats – it is the # 1 news app in the country, it touches 60% of Canadian millennials online every month, it is the most trusted news source in the country, the most trusted brand in the country, the #1 Canadian digital media company in the country and it reach more Canadians online than any other Canadian company.

The Challenges - The need to maintain the Corporation's more mature legacy services while investing in new digital strategies is incredibly costly and the CBC's budget is not growing. Canadians have learned to expect content everywhere, rely more on their phones than any other device and prefer the internet over cable.

The number of competitors providing content is staggering...Netflix is the #1 channel in Canada and is in close to 60% of Canadian homes. The content is excellent and seems "infinite". Money is no object. 10 episodes of The Crown costs 130 million, the equivalent of the total non-news budget of the CBC for a year.

The CBC workforce needs to be modern with diverse talents that are in constant learning mode.

Meeting the challenges - The Corporation's audience - its stakeholders - are Canadian and that understanding needs to guide everything it does.

It is investing in technology, especially ensuring the delivery of content on all platforms. CBC launched Gem, its own OTT platform last year, available for \$4.99/month without ads, free with. It is also aggregating other Canadian content from sources like TVO and the NFB to run on Gem.

It is initiating experiments in Artificial Intelligence for CBC News. As an example, the CBC news service is first up when a user asks Alexa for the news.

The CBC is investing in as much programming as it can and is partnering with global giants like Netflix for programs like Anne and Alias Grace, in order to gain larger budgets.

And finally, work is being done to transform CBC's workplace culture. Diverse hires have been increasing -- 37% in the last quarter – with the aim of better reflecting Canadian audiences. A diverse emerging leaders program has been created in order to qualify staff from within and unconscious bias training has been initiated with success. For all else to work, the CBC needs to foster an environment where people want to come and do their best work and without the carrot of great pay.
